
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## From Basel with love

Simon Vander Plaetse is a Ladybird alumnus who had just finished his B. Mus in guitar at the *Hochschule für Musik* in Basel, Switzerland. He has chosen to participate in a music education programme which supports the Music School Rwanda, Kigali. This programme is formed in partnership with *Crescendo*, the European, Basel-based organisation for professional Christian artists and Best Future from Today (BFT), a subsidiary of the Rwandan Presbyterian Church. This is his inspiring story on how he guides and supports this music school from Basel.

The Music School Rwanda is now a little older than a year with no-one building and supporting the teachers. Classes take place at the BFT headquarters, as well as two other Presbyterian parishes in Kigali. There are currently about nine local teachers and around two-hundred students. The Music School is intended as an outreach project, and as such the lessons are free for the learners. The teachers are payed according to how many hours they teach, through donations by Crescendo.





Simon's was assigned to teach Coucou Olivier, the local guitar teacher. 'I had been doing some skype lessons with him, so it was great to finally meet him in person to give him lessons. In the afternoon, I would come along to observe his lessons and guide him afterwards in terms of methodology. Sometimes, I also helped some of the teachers with theory. The goal is that all the local teachers pass at least the ABRSM Grade 5 Music Theory





There are many positive things already in place in just one year, 'We have motivated, talented teachers who are willing to learn and are very nice people. There are lots and lots of eager students, and a good support from the Presbyterian Church. However, there are also some problems, of which many are organizational aspects. Students do not attend the classes regularly, but almost every week there are new students, so the

level of the group does advance. There aren't enough instruments (especially for piano and guitar) so the guitar gets passed around when learning something, which makes progress even slower.'

Fortunately, during this trip, some solutions have been put into place to counter some of these problems. 'I was not involved in the organisational aspects of the training, so I don't really know the details, but I have good faith in the leader of the school! The goal is that eventually, after a few years, we do not need to come anymore

on regular training, and the Music School is fully functional without the outside help and training.'

The next trip the *Crescendo* teachers plan to make is in June or July 2020. In the meantime, Simon is doing Skype lessons with Coucou to support and guide him to higher performance levels. We wish Simon the best with the supporting role he plays in this exciting and worthy project, his future post-graduate music studies in Europe and are motivated by his zest.


